One worker a week dies on construction sites around Australia and 20-24 year-olds in the building and construction industry are four times more likely to have a fatal accident than those in other industries. Everybody wants to be safe, yet factors like budget and time constraints and the desire to take short cuts when the pressure is on often conflict with the desire to put safety first. If you hold a safety critical role, this workshop helps you build the skills and competencies to manage the safety of others in your workplace more effectively.

- Understand how to manage risk
- Identify key activities that make up a safe and high performing work culture
- Create a practical safety improvement action plan to implement in their workplace team
- Discover how to manage people who demonstrate unsafe behaviours
- · Learn how to improve reporting (incidents and near misses).
