Background

- Original “Construction Site Safety Culture” Project outlined 39 Safety Management Tasks (SMT’s) for 11 safety critical positions
- The project developed for each of the 39 SMT’s
 - process steps
 - Knowledge, skills and behaviours
 - Culture outcomes



Background

- Next step aims to continue the development of the original project by
 - Selection of a smaller number of logical occupational groupings
 - Development of SMT Implementation packs for each audience
 - Consult with industry on design and content
 - Provide up to 100 complimentary starter kits to industry



Methodology

Phase 1

- Identify Key Organisations
 - The original 11 ACA companies
 - Additional five 2nd tier companies
 - Regulatory bodies for comment



Methodology

- Develop draft material for comment
 - Four audiences tentatively identified
 - Managers
 - Safety professionals
 - Engineers and Project Managers
 - Construction Site Workers



Methodology

- Industry feedback on draft material
 - Material provided to all 16 companies
 - 8 companies will be visited by the CI's
 - Regulatory bodies invited to comment
 - This to occur in July 07
 - Following feedback, development of near to final material for comment



Methodology

- Industry feedback on near to final material
 - Material provided to all 16 companies
 - Other 8 companies will be visited by the CI's
 - Regulatory bodies invited to comment
 - This to occur in September 07
 - Following feedback, development of final material



Project Completion

- Product launched Nov/Dec 07
- 100 complimentary kits provided to participating companies
- Additional kits for purchase from either CRC CI or OFSC



Some early ideas

- Material customised for each audience
- Range from hot-linked web based data to plasticised flip charts for use on site
- Incorporation of current best practice via industry consultation
- Material designed for easy updates
