## Facilities management takes centre stage

The Sydney Opera House – Australia's most famous landmark and one of the busiest performing arts centres in the world – has taken centre stage as the case study for award winning research for the facilities management (FM) industry.

The FM Exemplar Project: Sydney Opera House, was completed late last year, representing the output of 23 participants from 10 organisations across three research streams.

The final report integrating digital modelling, services procurement and performance benchmarking was entitled FM as a Business Enabler.

The FM Exemplar Project: Sydney Opera House, has received the Facility Management Association of Australia's Rider Hunt Terotech Industry Achievement Award for excellence in facility management strategy and practice.

The award was presented at the FMA Australia ideaction 2007 conference gala dinner in Sydney.
