BRITE Project series: Contractors deliver – innovation levels on the rise



THE construction industry is a strong performer in the innovation field, according to statistics released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics in December last year. The statistics also revealed that innovation levels are on the rise across all Australian industries.

This information has been compiled as part of research carried out by the CRC for Construction Innovation, which was established in 2001 under the Australian Government's Cooperative Research Centres Program.

The BRITE Project aims to improve the rate and quality of innovation in the construction industry and to address the traditional scepticism of many stakeholders in the industry about the potential for innovation and its likely benefits.

The ABS defines innovation as "the use of new or significantly improved goods, services, or processes."

According to the BRITE Project, the ABS statistics comprise Australian businesses employing more than five people.

the civil and building sectors, while consultants and construction suppliers are allocated to other industries.

The ABS statistics found that growth in contractor innovation keeps pace with other industries.

The proportion of contractors undertaking innovation increased by 3.6 percentage points from 2002-03 to 2004-05. The BRITE Project team said this was roughly equal to the growth in proportion of all Australian businesses undertaking innovation, which was 3.9 percentage points over the same period.

The statistics revealed that contractors put more effort into innovation in managerial and operational processes, than in developing new goods and services.

However, twice as many contractors were engaged in developing new goods and services in 2004-05 than in 2002-03. For this reason contractors are now more evenly spreading their attention across the three main innovation types – managerial, operational and goods/services.

The BRITE Project of the CRC for Construction Innovation is actively engaged in assisting contractors and other construction industry participants to improve their innovation performance across the three key areas.
