Digital modelling and BIM technologies are acknowledged as crucial to the future of the design, construction and facilities management industry. Presently these technologies are being used in isolation by different parts of the supply chain, limiting their potential.

Individual efforts to change the industry's culture, processes and technology are now being brought together worldwide in the buildingSMART movement, which has established an open standard (IFC) for the use of object technology in construction and facilities management.

With the US Government soon requiring all newly commissioned projects to be modelled in IFC-compliant software and the German Federal Government planning to adopt BIM and IFC for its construction programs, it's not a question of if your organisation will become IFC- compliant, but when.

This will be a major networking event for all Project Managers in Queensland. It recognizes the significant impact of professional project management on the state economy.
